**Where?** UNESCO City of Design Graz (Styria), Austria

**When?** 16<sup>th</sup> -23<sup>rd</sup> of September 2011 (exchange week)

**Who?** 30 youngsters (4participants+1 leader) from six countries

**What?** Action 3.1. youth exchange with the topic of diversity, volunteering and social inclusion in relation with human rights, arts, media and outdoor activities!

**Partners:** Austria, Portugal, Georgia, Turkey, Israel, Ukraine.

**What is it all about?**

**Multiplicity WANTED!** is an international youth project for awareness-rising concerning various aspects of **diversity and anti-discrimination** of young people with different cultural backgrounds in the area of non-formal education.

Under the slogan "**Inclusion for R(E)volution!**", the project puts creative approaches in the field of diversity and social inclusion in order to promote a **common vision** of tolerance and cosmopolitan values. As connecting elements between the 30 participants aged between **18 and 25 years**, we use **media, arts, culinary experiments as well as sports and outdoor activities**. The project lasts four months, starting with a preparatory visit in July 2011. The intercultural exchange week will take place in the **UNESCO City of Design Graz** (Southern Austria) **from 16<sup>th</sup> Sept - 23<sup>rd</sup> Sept 2011**. Various subjects such as **social inclusion of migrants and minorities, gender and volunteering in relation with Human Rights and the UN-Millennium Development Goals** are dealt with during the activities. The principal purpose of the **Action 3.1. youth exchange** is the creation of **more solidarity** among the youngsters as well as the construction of a **lasting network** between the partner countries for building up a **strong community of young multipliers** who are aware of the **treasure of diversity** and who can face **future challenges** of a global society.
